Inland Children's Chorus Marks Silver Anniversary

Silver anniversary of the Inland Children's chorus will be celebrated Tuesday when the 100-voice ensemble presents its traditional Christmas concert at Memorial hall.

The 8:30 p.m. program under the direction of Joseph P. Geiger will be given for Inland Manufacturing division employes, their families and guests.

Fifty boys and as many girls will participate in the concert. The boys will wear the Eton suits and the girls, Alice Blue gowns. The same silver and blue setting which has been traditional will be employed.

The chorus, organized in 1936

by the late Richard Westbrook, made its first appearance Dec. 20 of that year. Geiger has been director since 1955.

The concert group is drawn from a chorus of 250 children ranging from 8 to 16. In addition, a junior chorus has been organized to give all the children a chance to appear

in concert during the year.

The program, for which Paul Ray Jones is accompanist, will include 16th and 17th century Christmas carols, Brahm's Cradle Song, Adams' O Holy Night and the 15th century Echo Song by Orlando di Lasso. French and Welsh carols will also be presented.
