Louise Blair, solo organist for the occasion, will play "Silent Night" in an arrangement by Kreckel, Walton's "Coventry Carol," Richard Purvis's "Greensleaves" and Pierne's "Prelude-Toccata." Mrs. Blair is a member of the American Guild of Organists, corresponding secretary, the Choirmasters club, and board member, Dayton Music club.
