Inland Chorus To Give Broadcast

A program of carols especially arranged for children's voices will be featured by the Inland Children's chorus in a Christmas eve broadcast over radio station WLW, Cincinnati. The program will be heard from 6 to 6:30 p. m., Tuesday. While the children's chorus will sing from the Dayton Art Institute auditorium, station WLW will take the program to Cincinnati by wire and broadcast it from there.

Directed by Richard Westbrook, the Inland Children's chorus, which is under the sponsorship of the Inland Manufacturing Division, General Motors Corp., has a membership of 190 boys and girls of ages from 6 to 16. Mr. Westbrook has trained and directed the chorus since it was begun five years ago. From the 190 total membership, 100 boys and girls are chosen to perform in concert appearances. This system provides a competitive note that makes a place in the chorus for public performances an important goal for each child.

For its Christmas eve broadcast, the chorus will present a program of carols which have been arranged to relate in music the story of the Nativity scene.

The Inland Children's Chorus of Dayton, voices under the direction of Richard Westbrook, will be heard in a half-hour program of Christmas carols over WLW on Christmas Eve, 6 p. m.

The program will originate at the Dayton Art Institute Auditorium, over direct lines to WLW. The participants range in age from seven to 16 years, and all are children of employees of the Inland Manufacturing Co. of Dayton. The chorus was organized five years ago. Prior to the WLW broadcast it will make an appearance with the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra.
