The Inland Children's Chorus was organized in 1936 by Col. Wallace S. Whittaker in order to give the children of Inland Manufacturing Division employes a musical education which they otherwise might not be able to enjoy. Since its inauguration, this group of 190 youngsters between the ages of 8 and 16 has made a notable contribution to the cultural life of Dayton.

The Chorus has enjoyed the distinction of appearing seven times as guests of the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as singing on a national radio chain program sponsored by General Motors Corporation. In addition, annual Spring Festivals and Christmas Eve broadcasts over local radio stations have helped make this young group one of the Yuletide institutions of the midwest.
