

THE INLAND CHILDREN'S CHORUS

The Inland Children's Chorus has been performing in the Spring Concert Series, sponsored by the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce and the Dayton Art Institute since 1943.

The group was first formed in 1936 as an outgrowth of Inland's Christmas parties at which talented employees or their children were invited to perform.

The purpose of the chorus is:

1. To give the children of Inland employees a musical education and an appreciation of good music, and,
2. To make a worthwhile contribution to the cultural life of Inland employees and the community.

There are 100 voices in the Children's Chorus Concert Group, 50 boys and 50 girls. An additional 80 boys and girls act as chorus understudies. Approximately 1,6000 children have sung in the chorus since it was founded.

It was directed by Richard Westbrook until his death in 1955. He was succeeded by Joseph P. Geiger, who is well-known in Dayton for his work with young people and children.

Musicale Features Children's Chorus

2 Concerts Scheduled Tomorrow; Chamber Music Program Set

The Inland Children's chorus, 200 strong, will make its annual appearance on the Winter Musicale series tomorrow at the Dayton Art Institute. Identical concerts will be given at 2 and 4 p.m.

Chorus director Joseph Geiger has programmed traditional numbers and selections from contemporary stage music including Dieterich's "Kyrie Eleison," "No Man Is an Island" by Whitney-Kramer, and "Danny Boy."

The second half of the program will include "Are You Sleeping," Simone's arrangement of "Children's Marching Song," "Surrey With the Fringe on the Top" by Richard Rodgers; Meredith Willson's "Till There Was You," and "Gay 90 Fantasy" and "America Our Heritage" by Steele.

Pianists, Trio To Play

The Dayton Chamber Music society will present Mary Morris and Alverda Fitzgerald, duo-pianists, and a trio composed of David Epstein, pianist and composer of the work, Larry Grika, violinist, and Leonard Feldman, cellist, tomorrow at 8:15 p.m. in the Italian room of the Dayton Art institute.

Epstein, Antioch college faculty member, composed the work in 1953 and received an award for it the following year in national competition. It is based upon European and Hebraic folk and religious music.

Grika, also a faculty member at Antioch received his education at Roosevelt university and Catholic university. He is

2 Programs By Inland Chorus Set

The Inland Children's chorus under the direction of Joseph P. Geiger will make two ap-



pearances today at the Dayton Art Institute. The programs, identical in nature, will be given at 2 and 4 p.m.

The concerts are part of the winter series sponsored by the music committee of the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce and the Dayton Art Institute.

The chorus is made up of children from the families of Inland Manufacturing division employes.

Geiger has scheduled a program that includes sacred and classical music in addition to show tunes from Broadway. Included are the Kyrie Eleison of Dieterich, Britten's All People That on Earth Do Dwell, Simeone's arrangement of the Children's Marching Song, Meredith Willson's Till There Was You and Steele's America Our Heritage.
